What Happened At P&C? - February 2020

Dear parents and carers,

We had two excellent evening and daytime parent meetings this month. Thanks to those parents and community members who attended, close to 35 people! We covered a number of topics:

- Year 7 Advisers: Nikolina Cupac and Callum Wilcox gave an overview of how Year 7 have settled into the school. Year 7 have made a great start to their high school education!
- School expectations: Michael Lane, Deputy Principal, ran an excellent seminar on a range of issues including attendance, uniform, social media and avenues of support. Parents are encouraged to monitor their child's use of social media and ensure they establish clear boundaries at home for the use of devices which includes checking them in with parents before children go to sleep. I spoke about how Net Nanny software (https://www.netnanny.com/) can be used to assist in monitoring internet and social media usage.
- **Stymie**: A reminder that the Stymie website can be used to anonymously report bulling and other issues to the school: https://www.stymie.com.au/
- **HSC results**: I provided an overview of our excellent HSC results from 2019. This included 45 x Band 6 results (a mark over 90%), 161 x Band 5 results (a mark between 80% and 89%), two students achieving a state ranking for VET Business Services and a top ATAR of 96.65.
- Year 7 (2020) BBQ + Year 7 (2021) Information Evening: Both of these events will be held simultaneously on Tuesday, 25 February 2020.
- **Homework and study notes**: Parents are encouraged to read from page 41 of the *Student Information Booklet* (https://www.cecilhillshigh.nsw.edu.au/assets/resources/2020-CHHS-Student-Information-Booklet-2020.pdf) for ideas on homework, study and revision. A simple template has been developed for students to type up three things they learned in each lesson which then automatically forms study notes.
- **Next meeting:** The next evening meeting will take place at 6:30pm on Monday, 2 March 2020 (which will be the P&C Annual General Meeting) and our daytime meeting will take place at 9:30am on Thursday, 5 March 2020. These meetings are for us to share information with you and we benefit from these meetings just as much as you. Your presence and ideas are what we need.

Thanks to everyone who came to our meeting. I look forward to continuing to work with our parents and community members. Please let me know if you have any questions.



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



Homework

At Cecil Hills High School, students are expected to complete homework. This includes revision, studying, assessment tasks, work set by the teacher and any other task that supports teaching and learning within the classroom. Research shows that good homework habits can improve student progress by an additional five months over a calendar year. The following is a guide to the amount of homework to complete:

Year 7 and Year 8: 1½ hours each nigh Year 9 and Year 10: 2 hours each night Year 11 and Year 12:

1½ nours each night 2 nours each night 3 nours each night
Students are required to use their diary to record homework. Parents are requested to sign their child's diary

sach week. Connect teachers work with students to promote positive homework habits and check student use of the diary. Parents should note that students will <u>always</u> have something to do at home to support their learning. If your child reports they have completed all of their work, you can work with your child to undertake the following:

- Study notes: It is important for students to revise by summarising what they have learned. This can be
 as simple as writing three summary sentences for each lesson to create study notes.
- Reading a novel: One of the best ways to improve literacy is to read a novel. Our school library has many
 novels and Liverpool City Council libraries at Carnes Hill, Green Valley and Liverpool also have a wealth of
 reading material: https://myllbrary.liverpool.nsw.gov.au/
- Moodle: This is our online learning platform which has a number of resources, links, quizzes and activities for students to complete, You can access Moodle here: https://web3.cecithills-h.schools.nsw.edu.au/moodle/
- Mathletics: Year 7 to Year 10 students have a Mathletics account. The website has numeracy activities

- Assessment tasks: Every course from Year 7 to Year 12 has regular assessment tasks. Our school
