What Happened At P&C? - March 2019

Dear parents and carers

- Home study area: It is important for students to have a home study area where they can focus, get organised
 and complete high quality work. This needs to be away from distractions, gadgets, devices and phones.
 Technology should only be used if it is assisting in the study and revision. The home study area ideally should
 not be in the bedroom. It can be useful for students to have some small whiteboards in the home to map out
 their ideas and answers before committing pen to paper.
- Assessment matters: I provided an overview of a number of assessment matters including the use of
 assessment schedules, assessment planners and tips for parents. It is important for all parents to download
 the relevant assessment booklet from our school website and then use this to map out the year in relation to
 assessment tasks and due dates. This will help parents keep track of when these are due. In addition, it
 gives parents an idea on what their children can be working on at home. Assessment task notifications can
 be downloaded from Moodle.
- **Homework**: There is always something that students can be doing at home. They can be revising their work from the day, completing some study, planning/completing an assessment task, reading a novel from the school library or local library, accessing Mathletics or writing study notes.
- **Study notes**: Students should get into the habit of revising their work by writing study notes each day. A simple way to do this is for students to write out three things they learned each lesson.
