
Excellence in leading

What is the EPP?



The Educational Pathways Program (EPP) is a high-profile ministerial project within the Department of Education.



Piloted in Feb 2020- June 2022 across 24 schools



Now across 168 schools (20 new schools this year)

What's been happening in our region?

In Cowpasture in 2023:

- There were 35 Innovating Careers Education (ICE) student initiatives in Cowpasture. 2,024 students participated in these initiatives.
- 3 professional learning sessions were delivered to staff Cas, TAs, HTs, SBAT EOs and Senior Executive.
- **266** Cowpasture students successfully completed **28** TAFE Start Your Future Courses across **7** campuses.
- 13 Cowpasture students participated in 1 Apprenticeship and Traineeship Head Start Course.
- There were 2 VET Ambassador visits to 564 students across Cowpasture schools.
- EY delivered 5 Job readiness Workshops to 5 of schools, totalling 139 students.
- **7** TAFE Early School Leaver (ESL) referrals were made for under 17-year-old students studying at TAFE full time.
- 39 Back in the Game referrals were made to Yourtown.
- 23 students from 2 of Cowpasture schools participated in the Industry Pathways Program (IPP) manufacturing immersion days.



Year 8 Subject Selection - Year 9 2025

To support students in making these decisions, the process includes.

- The Year 9 2025/ Year 10 2026 Electives Selection booklet will be placed on the Year 8 Google Classroom. Hard copies will be provided on request.
- In Term 3, an email will be sent to students and parent/carers through the Sentral portal address that will guide students to make choices. This will take place after the face-to-face subject selection evening on Tuesday 30 July 2024 between 4pm - 5pm in Term 3, 2024.

Use these rules when choosing subjects:

ABILITY – choose subjects you are good at.

INTEREST – choose subjects you enjoy.

MOTIVATION – choose subjects you really want to learn.

Decisions regarding the post-Year 10 pathway are important for all students


To support students in making these decisions, the process includes:

- Student survey to identify their ideas for 2025
- Which Way Now: a 2-day workshop program this Thursday and Friday (Students must have their charged laptop)
- Students and parents have access to subject information and offerings
- Subject Selection Evening Tuesday 30 July 2024 5:15-6:30pm
- Individual interviews for every Year 10 student and their parents -Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday 5-7 August 2024.

Year 7 2025 Transition

- The transition process for Year 7 2025 is well underway.
- · Applications are in the process of being finalised,
- The Year 7 2025 Year Advisers, Ms Fisher and Ms Hyde, have visited our partner primary schools and met with students twice, with another visit planned for Term 3.
- Selected students will attend Impact Day in Term 4.
- All Year 7 2025 students will attend Orientation Day on Tuesday 3
 December.
- In preparation for 2025, information is gathered from primary schools of all students regarding literacy, numeracy, additional support required and social connections.
- We are looking forward to welcoming the HSC class of 2030!
